French-language courses	A five-week French language intensive program is offered from mid-July to mid-August. <u>http://www.elul.ulaval.ca/sgc/lang/en_CA/pid/6430</u> This program combines the latest second language pedagogical techniques, and diverse orientation and socio-cultural activities that will facilitate and accelerate students learning, and enable them to become familiar with the French-speaking culture in North America. The School of languages will charge activity fees for <i>Français</i> <i>langue étrangère</i> (FLE) level courses. This applies to all semesters (summer, fall, spring).
Exams	Exams are normally held in the 3 rd week of December (fall semester) and end of April/beg. May (winter semester).

Course selection	Pre-arrival selection with home university academic advisor required. Confirmation of classes at Laval at the beginning of the semester, based on schedule availability and subject to the students being approved by the program director. Students wishing to take a language course must register to a placement test before the start of the semester. Places in these classes are limited.

Orientation period	Registration is the week before classes start and there is a two-day welcoming fair "La Rentrée UL" during the first week of classes.
Off campus work / internships	Exchange students are not eligible for off-campus work or internships.
Visa requirements	Québec Certificate of Acceptance and Canadian Study Permit are required for a study period exceeding 6 months. Students may also require a Visa depending on their nationality. They should consult the Web site of the Canadian Embassy or Consulate of their country.
Campus facilities	40 pavilions, 11 off-campus buildings and/or sites, a very large sports complex, library, Services Building (pub, bank, cafeteria, hair salon, bookstore, student unions, etc). Most public transportation routes stop on campus.
Distance from city / airport	10 km from Old Quebec/15 km from the airport
